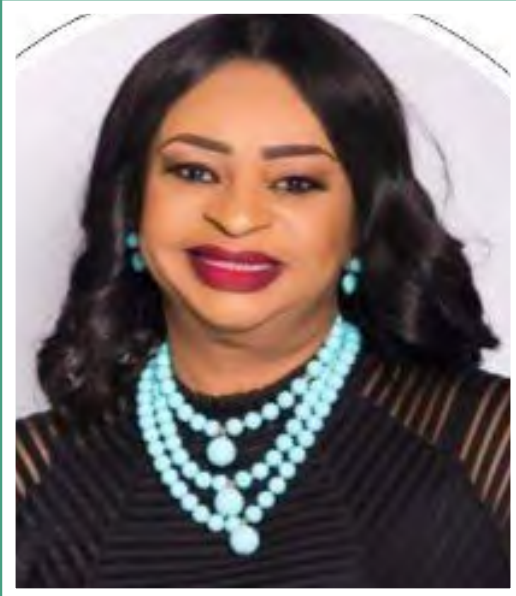
6. Thank you for your trust and support. I look forward to working closely with all of you to make our community stronger and more vibrant. I enjoin you to continue to keep the flag flying.
