A banner without stain.



## NAPAC USA'S IMPACT

The Nigerian American Public Affairs Committee (NAPAC) USA is a pivotal organization dedicated to empowering the Nigerian American community. Guided by the motto “Our Vote, Our Voice, Our Power,” NAPAC USA advocates for political empowerment, social change and establishes essential support systems while amplifying the voices of future generations.

## KEY ACHIEVEMENTS:

## Q1 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

NAPAC USA's Q1 2025 Achievements Report showcases significant progress:

- » **Strengthening Infrastructure:** Conducted a comprehensive audit of PAC leadership contacts and implemented a centralized communication hub, reducing email response times by 40%. Developed brand guidelines, resulting in a 35% increase in social media engagement.
- » **Advocacy & Coalition Building:** Established formal relationships with three major Nigerian American organizations and partnered with the Nigerian Embassy for a policy briefing attended by over 400 community members. Created a joint task force with the Nigerian Center and Nigerian Lawyers Association (NALA) to monitor immigration policy developments. And started

ongoing collaborative efforts with The Alliance of Nigerian Organizations in Georgia (ANOG) and the Nigerian Center in Washington, DC.

- » **Community Empowerment:** Organized a “Know Your Rights” seminar with immigration attorneys, provided consultations for families facing immigration challenges, and initiated a bill for multilingual “Immigration Rights” pamphlets in California.
- » **Legal Assistance Program:** Finalized a 2-year MOU for a \$100,000 legal defense fund, developed eligibility criteria for free legal services, and identified 15 pro-bono immigration attorneys.
- » **Foreign Policy Advocacy:** Submitted testimony to the House Subcommittee on Africa regarding Nigeria’s CPC designation, organized a letter-writing campaign generating over 1,000 messages to Congress, and secured a meeting with Chairman Smith’s office for policy recommendations.

## THE ROLE OF STATE PACS: SPOTLIGHT ON NAPAC GA

NAPAC USA operates through state-level Political Action Committees (PACs) like NAPAC GA, which influence policy at state and local levels. NAPAC GA focuses on:

- » **Supporting aligned candidates**
- » **Lobbying for or against state legislation**
- » **Promoting issues through awareness campaigns**
- » **Engaging in electioneering communications**

NAPAC GA, under the leadership of Chairman Edafe Sodje continually organize and champion supported candidates aligned with its interests through contributions, advertising, and grassroots campaigning, aiming to shape Georgia’s political landscape for the betterment of our diverse Nigerian and other African communities.

1. Download and install the app from relevant mobile app store  
(**Google Playstore**) create a profile and activate your account using a valid email.
2. Click on 'passport application services' tab on the landing page.
3. Proceed with the passport application process as indicated and ensure to choose the self enrollment option.
4. Make payment and note your application ID and Reference No.
5. Click the contactless biometric enrollment option on the passport application services.
6. Input your application ID and reference number as required to check eligibility and proceed.
7. If you are not eligible, proceed to book appointment via the NIS passport application portal (**passport.int.immigration.gov.ng**).
8. If eligible proceed with biometric (fingerprints and passport photograph) enrollment and submit appropriately.
9. Print your application form and payment receipt.
10. Send your old passport including your application form and payment receipt to the processing Embassy in a self-addressed return envelope (refusal to comply with this means that you will not receive your newly produced passport).
11. Wait for your passport to be delivered to the address indicated on your envelope within the stated timeline.


